



#### **CO+HOOTS Expands to Midtown**








model will take convenience to a whole new level by coming to you!

## How the Streets Got Their Names: Morris Drive By Derek D. Horn



Morris Drive, a short circular road that connects Lexington Avenue with 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, is tucked into the southwest intersection of 3<sup>rd</sup> Street and Osborn Road. This street name occurs only at this location in Phoenix and has its roots with some of the early residents of Midtown.

In 1895, a group led by banker and real estate investor Philip K.

Hickey created the Buena Vista tract containing 16 lots of almost 9.2 acres each, bounded by Central Avenue, Thomas Road, 7<sup>th</sup> Street, and Osborn. In 1920, the Morris brothers (Tom, Mike, and Theros) acquired Lot 3 at the southwest corner of 3<sup>rd</sup> Street and Osborn. The 1920 Phoenix directory lists Tom and Ethel as residents at 3<sup>rd</sup> and Osborn, and the other brothers occasionally lived there as well. By 1925, Tom bought out his brothers' shares in the property and he and Ethel became the sole owners of



Lot 3. It would be their family home for decades. In 1928, Tom and Ethel intended to create a subdivision of Lot 3, but the Great Depression reduced demand for housing and put their plan on hold.

After World War II, an influx of new residents increased the demand for housing, which provided another opportunity for the Morrises to subdivide. In January, 1946, they sold most of their acreage to Phoenix Title and Trust.




Lot 3 was subdivided into 35 lots for both residential and commercial development and named Buena Vista Park. The plat created Morris Drive after the former owners, and Tom and Ethel kept a large parcel at the corner of 3<sup>rd</sup> and Osborn that surrounded their house.

New homes quickly went up in Buena Vista Park. A 1949 aerial photograph shows a house on every residential lot and stores on all the commercial lots along 3<sup>rd</sup> Street. Over the decades that followed, most of the houses in Buena Vista Park were converted into professional offices or knocked down for commercial development. Some still remain as private residences and the shops along 3<sup>rd</sup> Street still exist.

Tom and Ethel lived at 3<sup>rd</sup> and Osborn until Ethel passed away in the mid-1950s. Tom stayed on until he died about 10 years after. The Morris house had been demolished by 1969, and in 1972 the Morris family sold the lot for commercial development. The Arizona Association of Realtors building now occupies the site.

# Travel Tips: How to Get the Best Deal from Hotwire.com

Hotwire.com is a great place to find deals online, but here are a few tips to help you find what you want and get the best deal.




First, Hotwire will only tell you the hotel after you have paid for it, but do not let that stop you. If Hotwire says the hotel is a 3,4 or a 5-star hotel, it will be what they say it is. If you want your hotel near a certain place (which could be a hotel you like), type that address in the location search field and Hotwire will give you the distance from the location you want to the hotels available. Frequently, it is the hotel you want to stay in.

I routinely stay in the same hotels every trip and save 30-50% off of the best rate on their website. Since I book through Hotwire, I do not get the perks of a frequent guest program, however, I can typically save enough after two nights to pay for another night. No frequent guest program does that. Take the amount you saved and buy dinner or put it in a savings account to buy your own perks where and when you want them.

If you want a little more certainty, Hotels.com is a partner of Hotwire, so you can check Hotels.com first. Find a hotel you want, get the address and number of stars, and then do a Hotwire search at the same location and number of stars. The hotel that comes up will most often be the same hotel as listed on hotels.com but 15% to 30% less.

Unless you book frequently through Hotwire, your booking will be non-refundable and non-changeable. If you feel there is any chance you may need to change the date of your hotel reservation, then wait until it is closer to your trip to get your hotel or pay for the hotel insurance on Hotwire.









## Using Ridesharing and Delivery Services in Your Apartment

If you have a gate or security code, let the driver know. If there's a guest gate code or a security point, send them the info via text or call ahead to security, so they know to let the car into the community.

Stay near your phone so the driver can contact you. Your driver may only have the physical address of your community. They may need to call you for specific directions to your home. If there's an easy milestone to find you, text this information to your provider.

Be ready for your driver or delivery person. They make their living based on time, so try not to make them wait. Or if you are delayed, let them know.

Leave the lights on outside. Early in the evening, these lights may help your driver find your home. When you arrive home that night, you will be glad to have the lights on to guide you safely to your door.

Choose an easy rendezvous point in your community. Maybe it's easier to meet near the front reception area of your community. Asking the driver to navigate a maze of parking areas can waste time and make you late.

The proliferation of the sharing economy allows more people to provide necessary services. We can do our part to help these providers make our lives easier.

#### Successful Container Gardening By Ron Mark



Selecting the type of plants to use in a container garden is not much different than purchasing a plant for around the outside of a home.

The availability of "houseplants" is so widespread that now you are able to buy plants almost anywhere: from

a department store, a street fair, the grocery store, and even your local plant nursery, however the best place to purchase will be a nursery where you would get professional help regarding what types of plants will work well in your specific circumstances. Take into consideration the exposure your garden area provides, as well as your lifestyle and the kind of care you will be able to provide.

Important conditions to consider include: the amount of available light, soil preparation, as well as what's required for watering, feeding, and trimming to keep your plants healthy. Remember to ask the sales person what the natural growth habits of the plant you are considering.

Generally speaking, the larger the leaf on a plant, the larger the plant and the longer the life. In addition, in some cases, the larger the container you can provide, the longer the life of the plant.

If you are a traveler and are away for long periods of time, you may want to consider cactus and succulents, rather than "leafy" plants, which can mean less time and effort needed for plant care!

### Create your Urban Retreat
